

But A Level study is a major step up from GCSE or equivalent and can be particularly challenging for those for whom English is not their first language, as to work at this level demands very good understanding and proficiency.



Students aged 15+ who wish to study A Levels and who demonstrate English proficiency at around B1 level (IELTS 4.5) and above. Candidates who are very able academically and whose English level is slightly below this may be considered.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

YEAR 1: BRIDGE YEAR

This three-year programme commences with a unique Year 1 'Bridge Year' which includes:

- A tailored English as an Additional Language (EAL) course to refine reading writing and listening skills to the standard required to access the Sixth Form curriculum in Years 2 and 3 of the course.
- The chance to sample two or three A Level subjects per term, both building basic subject knowledge and trialling/refining course choices.
- The opportunity to study for core Mathematics and EAL subjects to be taken at GCSE level the following year and gain the qualifications required by many universities.
- A tailored programme designed to develop the academic and practical skills needed to thrive at A Level and beyond.
- A dedicated Life in the UK course to broaden knowledge of life and culture.

YEARS 2 AND 3: DEVELOP AND COMPLETE

As students commence A Level study in their chosen subjects, tailored EAL and skills training continues alongside, helping them become fully university-ready:

- Students study for and take the university-required IELTS English qualification, usually in Year 2.
- English for Academic Purposes is taught in Years 2 and 3, preparing students for the demands of Higher Education.
- Students take part in Cobham Hall's outstanding Future Perspectives, Tutorial, Global Critical Thinking and other leadership programmes, as well as preparing the Extending Project Qualification (EPQ), so loved by universities.

In some circumstances, the Year 1 Bridge Year may be offered as a standalone course. Please contact Admissions for details.

Year 2 (12) DEVELOP

FCE (Cambridge B2 First Qualification) exam taken September.

IELTS programme commences, with qualification taken at the end of Year 12 (if proficiency allows).

Introduction to English for Academic Purposes.

Opportunity to take GCSE and additional Maths qualification.

Embark on A Level study for chosen subjects.

Usually 2 or 3 A Level subjects are taken, plus the Extended Project Qualification (worth 50% of an A Level). The EPQ delivers outstanding preparation for academic life at university.

10 lessons per fortnight for each subject, plus 2 for the EPQ.

A CURRICULUM FOR THE FUTURE

Our Sixth Form programme is centred around A Levels but is broad and significantly skills-based, offering a range of unique educational strands; including Global Critical Thinking, Study Skills and University application support.

These strands are further enhanced and supported by our bespoke Perspectives course designed to prepare students for life beyond school.





FUTURE PERSPECTIVES: LEADERSHIP AND LIFE SKILLS DEVELOPMENT

The Future Perspectives course equips Sixth Form students with essential life skills and self-awareness to prepare them for their future. It covers a range of topics, including:

- Personal goal-setting and life-planning.
- Time management, personal strengths, leadership, first aid, decision making, effective communication, self-confidence, career options.
- Engaging activities to allow students to apply their skills in real-life contexts, such as working with the elderly, helping the homeless and exploring car maintenance.
- A curriculum that delves into financial literacy, including budgeting, salaries, financial aid, and living independently.
- Entrepreneurial thinking and setting up a business with a limited budget.



EPQ EXTENDED PROJECT QUALIFICATION

(in a subject of student's choosing)

EPQ provides students with the opportunity to plan, research and develop their own project idea. The project can be in a variety of forms, including:

- A research-based written report
- A production (for example, a charity event, fashion show or sports event)
- An artefact (for example, a piece of art, a computer game or realised design)

The EPQ encourages independent learning and demonstrates that students have strong research skills and can reflect upon and evaluate a project, while the deeper understanding of a topic of interest it gives can also be a good discussion point in interviews. Furthermore, undertaking the EPQ trains students to manage their time and teaches planning techniques, desirable skills not only at university but also in the work environment.
